
On the occasion of the *“Parcours de la Céramique”* in Paris, France, we invite you to discover the art of earth and fire, through the flea markets of Paris/Saint-Ouen.

This week takes place in Paris the 13th edition of the **“Parcours de la Céramique”**. Among the dealers who exhibit, **Laurence Vauclair** is the specialist in 19th century slip. *“I prefer to say artistic ceramics,”* she says with a laugh. *I start with the World’s Fair of 1851. These are not asparagus plates!*

Indeed, her pieces are signed by Théodore Deck, Eugène Collinot or Delphine Massier. When she is not in her gallery on rue de Beaune, Laurence Vauclair is at the **Paul Bert market**, where she is currently exhibiting creations by Clément Massier,

Haviland «and Bernard Palissy followers: Joseph Landais, Charles-Jean Avisseau and Thomas Victor Sergent.”

Close to her booth, we skip a few dozen years to discover beautiful Primavera vases, on the **Intérieur Parisien XX^e** booth, by **Christian Meyer**. Next door, **Nathalie Dupuis** has opted for a more artistic, even sculptural ceramic, which flirts with the work of art, such as these unique pieces by Marcello Fantoni from the 1960s or the creations by François Maréchal from the 1980s.



A HYMN TO CERAMICS THROUGH TIME AND STYLES



In another aisle, still in Paul Bert, one can find at **Robin Corcos'**, between a floor lamp by Adnet and a tapestry by Lurçat, a very attractive rattan table decorated with Capron plaques.

Collectors also find their happiness at the Biron market. First stop at **Régis Taverne's**, a wealth of information when it comes to the Meissen manufactory. Its display cases abound with delicate porcelain, including an irresistible tea set decorated with vegetables and insects.

A little further down, still in the main aisle, back to the 19th century at **Alain Cical's**, who exhibits magnificent Art Nouveau and Art Deco ceramics. An entire showcase is devoted to the work of Auguste Delaherche and another one to the Carriès school in La Puisaye. A selection that will delight connoisseurs.

Opposite, we come across a second **Intérieur Parisien XX^e** booth, this time run by the delightful **Annie Spitzer**, where the furniture and wall lights from the 1930s interact with wonderful pieces by Edouard Cazaux and Jean Mayodon.

Finally, at the end of this aisle, is the **Tora Tori** space, by **Nathalie and Mayer Breche**. Here we cultivate a passion for Japan, where against the backdrop of screens and sabers stand out Meiji vases, bowls and stoneware tea pots.

The **Vernaison market** also has its address for ceramics: the **Artémisia gallery** and its pieces from the workshops of Marlotte, Montigny-sur-Loing, Gien, Longwy, Sarreguemines, Onnaing.

Finally, the walk can end - or start - with the **Jules Vallès market** where **Véronique Scaviner** is an outstanding bargain hunter. Every weekend, she unwraps her latest finds which are usually taken away by a lucky collector right away. She has a predilection for Vallauris ceramics, from the 1950s and 1970s, but she is always partial to a nice Keraluc service from Quimper.

A wealth for decorators who always come by her booths, before visiting more specialized dealers. Why not do the same?

EXHIBITION AT GALERIE DAUPHINE: THE INVISIBLES OF THE COLD WAR: KGB AND STASI

From 26 September 2020, Galerie Dauphine (Dauphine market) will host more than a thousand objects from Stéphanie M.'s collection, unveiled to the public for the first time: equipment from the secret services of the KGB and the Stasi such as the «Fialka» (the oldest Soviet model of electro-mechanical machine allowing the encryption / decryption of messages), transceivers, tape recorders, cameras and clandestine photographic devices specifically developed for special services. Uniforms, decorations, documents and exceptional relics from this dark period of history will also be on display for a "total" immersion of visitors into the secret world of the "invisible".
